Traditional role – medical work, doctors, nurses, first aid work, making bandages

Women attached to all except deValera's (afraid of danger and what they would see)

Supplied safe houses

First aid

Recognizance trips

Didn't fall under suspicion by British (i.e., small number women imprisoned)

Deeply significant

Safer for women to stand for office, since male politicians were arrested.
